- Applicants to mark levels 3-5 will have experience teaching key stage 2 in the relevant subject.
- Applicants to mark level 6 will have experience of teaching key stage 2 or key stage 3 in the relevant subject.

Competencies required:

- You are able to work well under pressure.
- You are able to meet deadlines.
- You are IT literate.
