

Chief Examiner

Role Summary

The Chief Examiner takes responsibility for a complete specification. They are responsible to the Chair of Examiners for ensuring that year on year the examination as a whole, including coursework, meets the requirements of the specification and maintains standards. Chief Examiners also undertake the role of Principal Examiner or Principal Moderator for at least one component of the examination.

Responsibilities

- To supervise the Principal Examiners and Principal Moderators.
- To supervise the construction of the question papers and mark schemes to ensure appropriate standards.
- To ensure that the question papers, as a whole, cover the assessment criteria as set out in the specification, and satisfactorily sample the appropriate content.
- To participate in the Awarding process, ensuring that there is comparability in the standards of awards made via different options or tiers.
- To act as Principal Examiner or Principal Moderator for at least one component of the examination.

Experience and Qualifications Required

- You will have a degree or equivalent.
- You will be a qualified teacher.
- You will have UK school-based teaching experience, in the relevant subject and qualification.
- You will have the right to work in the UK and a UK bank account.
- You will have assessment experience up to Team Leader level in the relevant qualification.
- You will have experience of managing people.

Competencies Required

- You will be a good communicator.
- You will have sound organisational skills.
- You will have the ability to work well under pressure.
- You will have the ability to meet deadlines.
- You will be IT literate.
